At our Winter Forum in November, we celebrated the 100th member to join The Garioch Partnership, by presenting them with a cheque for £100.

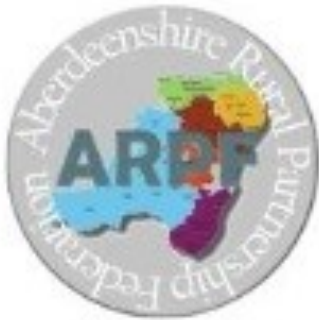
We were delighted that Cllr. Berry kindly stepped up to present the cheque for £100 to Lynne Copland, representing Garioch Women for Change.

Working in Partnership!

Aberdeenshire Third Sector Strategy Group (TSSG) provides a gateway to open and effective dialogue between Third Sector partners and Aberdeenshire Council. The group works to ensure it is strategically placed to play a valued and impactful role that is positioned to co-produce, design and shape policies affecting the third sector and communities. The TSSG includes representatives from the Aberdeenshire Rural Partnership Federation (ARPF), the local Third Sector Interface (TSI) Aberdeenshire Voluntary Action (AVA) and Aberdeenshire Council.

The group are embarking on a piece of work to help demonstrate the value of the third sector across Aberdeenshire. If successful, the purpose of this project will be to help strengthen the position of many Third Sector Organisations (TSO) to be recognised as a credible partner in the delivery of services.

We believe there are great examples of this already happening therefore the first stage is to obtain a picture of what our Third Sector currently looks like.

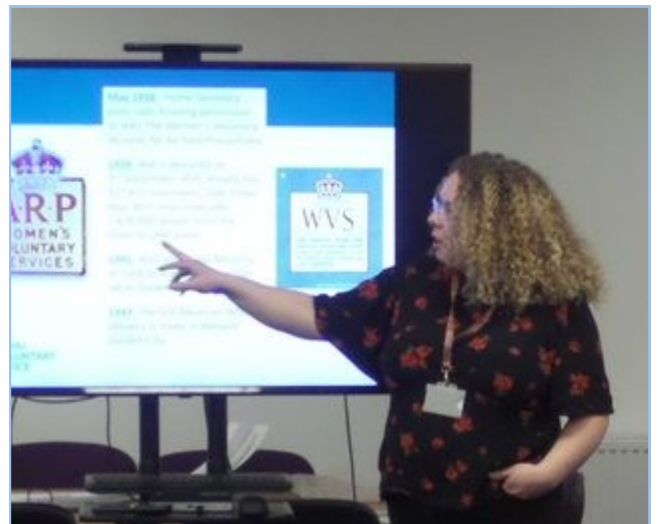
Our Winter Forum was held on a cold November evening, but there was a warm welcome and a Fly Cup fine piece for everyone who came along.

ROYAL VOLUNTARY SERVICE

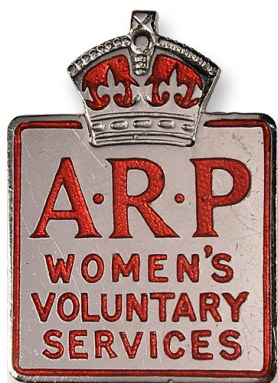
Elaine Sinclair joined us at our Winter Forum and shared a fascinating overview and history of Royal Voluntary Service (RVS).



She also gave us the opportunity to examine, and try on, an example of their original uniform!



The Women's Voluntary Services for Air Raid Precautions was founded in 1938 by Lady Stella Reading, aiming to help recruit women into the ARP movement assisting during and after air raids by providing emergency rest centres, feeding, first aid, and perhaps most famously assisting with the evacuation and billeting of children.



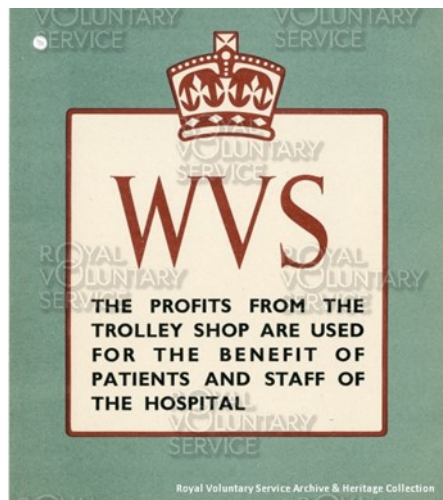
By 1943 the organisation had over one million volunteers and was involved in almost every aspect of wartime life from the collection of salvage to the knitting of socks and gloves

for merchant seamen.

After the war RVS transformed to become a leading organisation in the field of social care, pioneering the practices that formed the cornerstone of modern social services.

They changed their name to simply WRVS in 2004, and in 2013, they became Royal Voluntary Service. They are a volunteering charity, with nearly 20,000 volunteers across the UK who give their time to help make communities stronger.

RVS pride themselves on providing local services, based on local need. Services in Aberdeen and Aberdeenshire include the cafes, shops and trolley services at local hospitals, which help to fund their support services.

They run a Community Transport service as well as One to One Support services, designed to build confidence and help reconnect people with the things that make life worth living, so they can stay independent for longer.

In addition, their volunteer-run Social Clubs and Events provide a wide range of activities from dancing, crafts and gentle exercises to specialist interests as well as the opportunity to catch up with friends.

Garioch Women for Change were formed in April 2018. We are a women's group open to everyone of all ages and whose members are drawn from rural and urban areas. Our aims are to educate and empower, with the focus on the inclusion of as many diverse groups as possible and facilitate political participation.

The group held a Suffragette conference in September 2018, which was funded by the Scottish Government, to ensure that women were made aware of women's sacrifices and the significant contribution of the Suffragette Movement and its relevance to the role of women in politics in a modern context. It was held at Logie Durno Community Hall.

The ultimate aim of the conference was to encourage women of all ages and particularly those from rural environments to become engaged in political processes, whether that be at a community, local or national level.

The conference was a huge success and 124 women of all ages and background attended.

The groups activities have featured in magazine articles throughout 2018/19 and hope that coverage of a planned Eco Emergency Event in Inverurie Town Hall on March 7th 2020 will be national.

Garioch Women have been involved in local campaigns, collecting signatures and garnering support for e.g.. Market Street Primary CAT application, Good Food Policy meetings, Democracy Matters workshops, Modern Monetary Theory, Menopause Policy and successful Climate Change Cafes/ Conversations.

Garioch Women have travelled to Edinburgh and Glasgow attending conferences and meetings on a wide variety of topics including International Women's Day at the Scottish Parliament.

Garioch Women for Change are currently on a campaign highlighting changes to the NHS.

The group have taken their NHS presentation "on tour" since the Spring of 2019, and have trained facilitators in other areas e.g.. Edinburgh and Inverness to give presentations and spread their message.

Aberdeenshire Saxophone Orchestra is the only orchestra in Scotland playing the full range of instruments from Bass to Sopranino saxophones. Membership is open to anyone who can play the saxophone to at least grade 2 standard.

We have been awarded SCIO status. As a charity, our remit is to offer the experience of playing in an orchestra free to all those under 16 or in full-time education. We also own a selection of the more unusual sizes of saxophone which are available on loan to our members.

Our players benefit from the instruction and guidance of our world-class music director, Richard Ingham, who is a renowned saxophonist, composer and educator. (Richard Ingham, www.saxingham.com).

The saxophone orchestra is a wonderful opportunity for young people who may be going on to a career in music but it is also a life-enhancing activity for everyone. At the moment our ages range from 14 to 77.

We encourage people to take up their saxophone again, or borrow one of ours, and join us in this exciting and fun project.

Our repertoire includes a wide range of musical genres, including classical, jazz, pop, folk, traditional Scottish and contemporary. Many of these are not normally associated with the instrument and we believe that this will appeal to many and varied audiences.

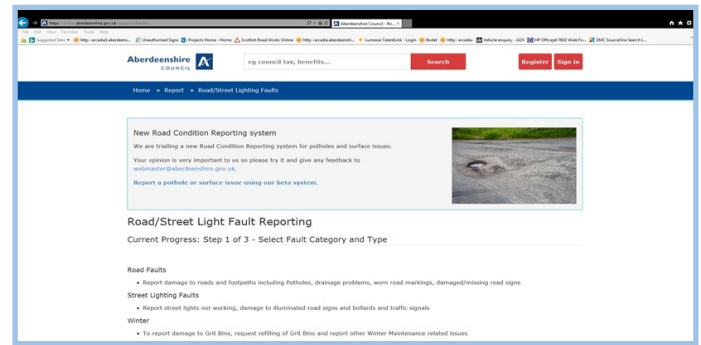

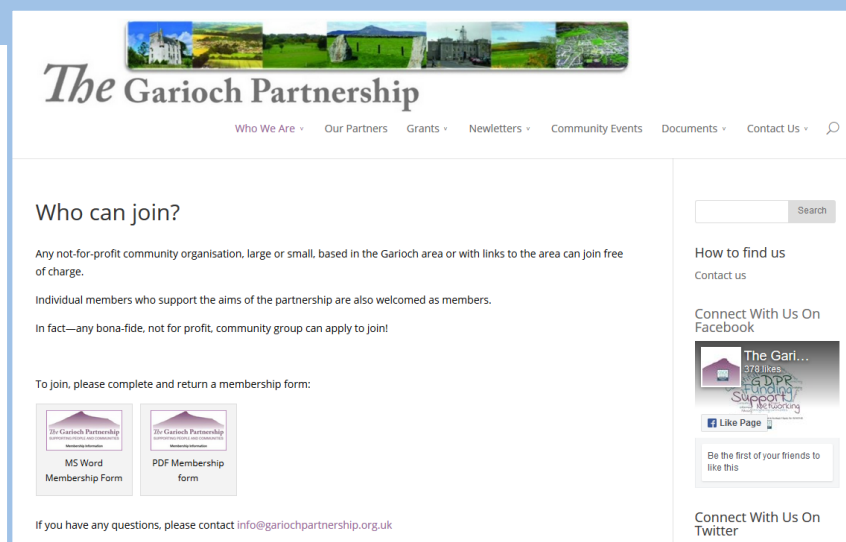

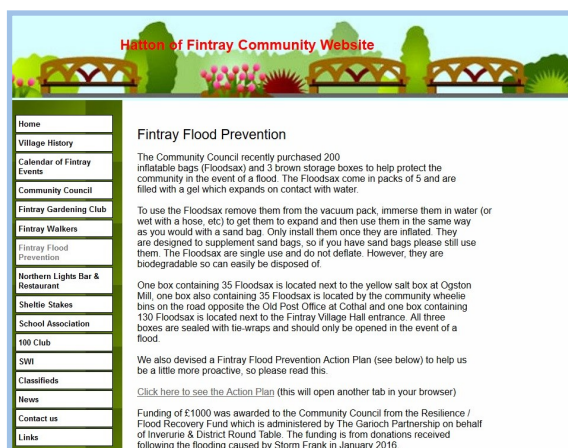
Resilience Funding

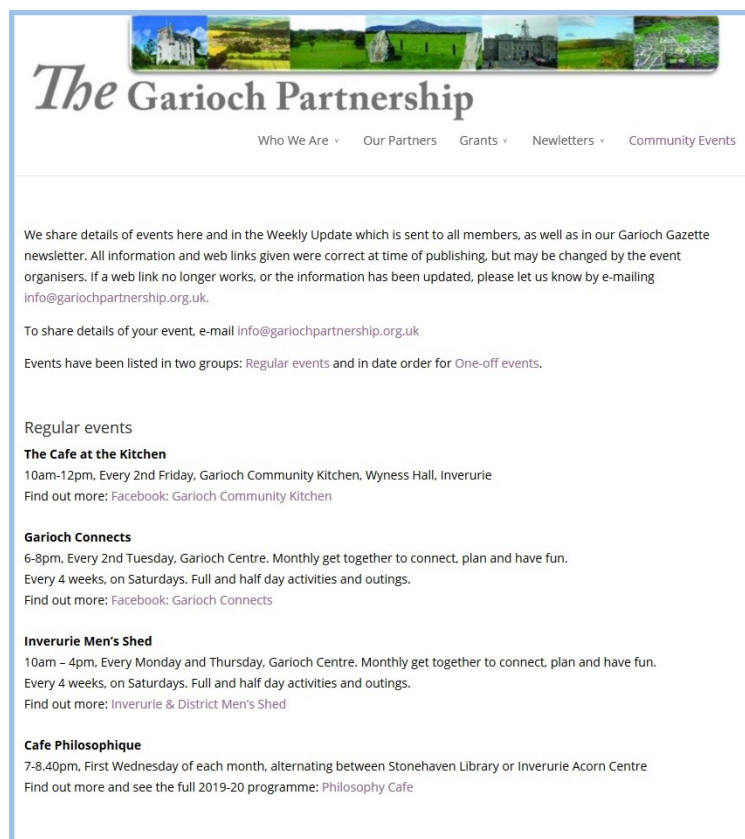
The Garioch Gazette is The Garioch Partnership's quarterly e-newsletter.
